LOCAL LAW NO. 4 FOR 2004

BE IT ENACTED by the Town Board of the Town of New Scotland as follows:

SECTION 1. Local Law No. 4 for 2004 is entitled:

**A LOCAL LAW OF THE TOWN OF NEW SCOTLAND, NEW YORK,
EXTENDING AN INTERIM APPLICATION PROCESS FOR WIRELESS
TELECOMMUNICATION FACILITIES.**

SECTION 2. **Purpose.** The Town of New Scotland is currently considering the enactment of a Local Law (hereinafter "Telecommunications Law") to govern the permitting, constructing and use of wireless telecommunications facilities and towers. On July 14, 2004 the Town Board adopted Local Law No. 3 for 2004, which provided for an interim application process to govern applications for the construction of such facilities while the enactment of a Telecommunications Law is being considered. Local Law No. 3 for 2004 is scheduled to expire on October 12, 2004. The purpose of this Local Law is to extend the interim application process for an additional 60 days, while the enactment of a Telecommunications Law is being debated. It is the further purpose of this Local Law that any interim application be subject to the terms and conditions of any telecommunications law enacted by the Town of New Scotland on or prior to December 11, 2004. This local law is in lieu of a moratorium.

SECTION 3. **60 day extension to interim application process.** Any and all applications for the permitting, construction, or use of wireless telecommunications facilities, or related structures and facilities, shall be subject to the terms and conditions of any Telecommunications Law enacted by the Town of New Scotland on or prior to December 11, 2004.

SECTION 4. **Effective date.** This local law shall take effect immediately upon passage.
