ORDINANCE

AUTHORIZING AND REGULATING THE CONDUCT OF GAMES OF

CHANCE IN THE TOWN OF NEW SCOTLAND

The following ORDINANCE was introduced by Charles

Houghtaling Jr. who moved its adoption and the same was

seconded by Wynmar Osterkot.

BE IT RESOLVED AND ORDAINED by the Town Board of the Town
of New Scotland as follows:

Section 1. Authority: Title. This ordinance is enacted pursuant to the authority of article nine-A of the general municipal law of the State of New York, and shall be known as the Games of Chance Ordinance of the Town of New Scotland.

Section 2. Definitions. The words and terms used in this ordinance shall have the same meaning as such words and terms are used in article nine-A of the general municipal law, unless otherwise provided herein or the context requires a different meaning; "town" means the Town of New Scotland, "officer" means the Chief Law Enforcement Officer of Albany County.

Section 3. Games of chance authorized; Restrictions. Games of chance may be conducted in the town by an authorized organization, after obtaining a license therefor, in accordance with the provisions, requirements and limitations of article nine-A of the General Municipal Law, the rules and regulations of the New York State Racing and Wagering Board and this ordinance.

Section 4. Effective Date. The ordinance shall take effect ten (10) days after approval thereof by a majority of the voters of the Town voting thereon at a special election and after publishing and posting as required by law.

Shall the ordinance duly adopted by the Town Board of the Town of New Scotland, Albany County, New York, on the 21st day of March, 1977, entitled "Ordinance authorizing and Regulating the Conduct of Games of Chance in the Town of New Scotland" which said Ordinance is enacted pursuant to the authority of Article nine-A of the General Municipal Law of the State of New York and provides for the conduct of games of chance in the town, by certain authorized organizations, after obtaining a license therefor, all in accordance with the provisions, requirements and limitations of said Article Nine-A, the rules and regulations of the New York State Racing and Wagering Board and this Ordinance, be approved.

A copy of the ordinance referred to in said proposition is on file in the office of the Town Clerk in said Town where the same may be examined by any interested person during regular business hours.

The place at which qualified electors of such Town shall vote at said special Town election is as follows: Town Hall, New Scotland Road, New Scotland (Slingerlands R.D.), New York.

Any registered voter of the Town of New Scotland, Albany County New York, shall be qualified to vote at such special Town election.
